GSPP IN THE WORLD

GSPP leadership and faculty spent March reaching out to the Kazakh and Central Asian community to recruit the next GSPP MPP and MPA cohorts. The Committee on Children Rights Protection under the Ministry of Education and Science, the Kazakh Humanities and Law Institute, and the Eurasian National University were visited. Outside of Kazakhstan, GSPP staff spent time connecting with potential candidates in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia and Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

EXECUTIVE EDUCATION

GSPP designed and hosted a three day Executive Education Program about evidencebased research practices for KAZGUU University faculty. Over the course of three Saturdays, GSPP faculty shared their expertise to help participants deepen their understanding of policy research and broaden the quality of their research. "GLASS CEILING" OF KAZAKHSTANI CIVIL SERVICE: INVISIBLE FOR MEN, REALITY FOR WOMEN

Although 56% of civil servants are females, only 10% women hold political positions. This gender gap is evident by the fact that there is only one female minister in government.

For Vlast.kz, GSPP Assistant Professor Saltanat Janenova explains the three major factors that hinder career development for Kazakhstani females in civil service. These include socio-cultural stereotypes in gender roles, a male-oriented organizational culture, and a stereotypical association of females with traditional spheres of work.

JOIN GSPP

The Master of Public Policy (MPP) and Master of Public Administration (MPA) application deadlines are on April 30. Soon to follow, the application for the new GSPP PhD in Public Policy will be due May 15. It is an exciting time to study with NU's GSPP program. Our faculty comprises international scholars and Central Asian experts who engage in scholarship and research informed teaching for graduate students. The GSPP has an established partnership with Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy in Singapore, which offers exchange opportunities for students. Admission is competitive and based largely on academic excellence with a professional focus.

The 2-year, full-time MPP program is designed to train highly skilled professional policy-makers and analysts for the public, private, or non-profit. It provides students with a strong foundation in policy formulation and analysis, program evaluation, and management. The curriculum comprises core modules, electives, and the Policy Analysis Exercise. The 18month MPA program prepares students for senior management roles in the public and non-profit sectors. It provides an intensive, interdisciplinary course of study for professionals who wish to work on complex issues of national, regional and global importance. Students in the MPA Program earn their degree while retaining their jobs, staying on their career trajectories, and enhancing their local professional network. The GSPP Public Policy PhD provides exceptional scholars with advanced programming to prepare them for positions in academia, government, and research organizations.
