THE CLIMATE CRISIS AND UNIVERSITIES: CAPTURING THE STUDENT PERSPECTIVE






Students want achieved are for universities to commit to:

- 1. Building **climate literacy** among all of the university's students and staff
- 2. Clarity and **transparency** about the university's relationships with third-parties
- 3. Including **Indigenous voices** in climate action decision making
- 4. Carbon **neutrality**
- 5. Minimizing **single-use plastic** in campus catering facilities

They also describe ways universities can support student climate action groups and projects.

GRANT-MAKING AND OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

2022 Education for Sustainable Energy Development (ESED) Scholarship Program, Global Sustainable Electricity Partnership

To inspire the next generation of innovators and thinkers to create a sustainable future. The scholarship program fosters the next generation of energy, climate, and electricity sector specialists who will be prepared to tackle the challenges of the future.

Benefits: up to USD 10,000 per year (max. two years); approx. 10 students awarded annually

Deadline: Apr 11, 2022.

Scientific Product Grant Program, Wildlife Acoustics

To support the advancement of animal biology research, habitat monitoring and environmental conservation. Provides scientists with products and software to help further their research into the study of bats, birds, frogs and other vocal wildlife.

Funding information: USD 12,000 per quarter

Deadline: May 15, 2022.

Call for Applications, Grant Program, Ekhaga Foundation

To promote human health by supporting the development of better food, natural medicines and healing practices, and to support research for a healthier way of life, which in itself may have a disease preventive effect.

Deadline: May 20, 2022.

Sophie Danforth Conservation Biology Fund, Roger Williams Park Zoo

Field studies and other projects that demonstrate a multi-disciplinary approach to biodiversity and ecosystem conservation, and projects that involve in-country collaborators receive the highest funding priority.

Deadline: Jun 1, 2022.

Project Grants Program, Standards and Trade Development Facility

To improve food safety, animal and plant health capacity to comply with international sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) requirements.

Funding information: project grants, up to a

maximum of USD 1,000,000. Deadline: Aug 12, 2022.

Global Innovation Fund (GIF)

This program seeks to invest in social innovations that aim to improve the lives and opportunities of millions of people in the developing world. Open to funding innovations in any sector as long as they can demonstrate their innovation improves the lives of those living on less than USD 5 PPP per day.

Range: USD 50,000 - 15,000,000

Deadline: ongoing

Rapid Response Fund, Open Technology Fund

Aims to facilitate the digital emergency response community to resolve threats in a timely and comprehensive manner for individuals, communities, and organizations whose free expression has recently been repressed.

Funding information: total value of support cannot exceed USD 50,000. Average support amounts are between USD 5,000 and 25,000.

Deadline: ongoing
