Launch of the SDSN Global Climate Hub

SDSN Global Climate Hub was launched on the 6th of July, in a pre-COP27 event that took place at the Academy of Athens.

The SDSN Global Climate Hub was announced by *Prof. Jeffrey Sachs, Columbia University, President of the UN SDSN and Maria Cortes-Puch, Vice President of SDSN.*The **Chair** of the SDSN Global Climate Hub will be **Prof. Phoebe Koundouri**, Professor at Athens University of Economics and Business and Denmark Technical University, as well as Director of the Sustainable Development Unit at ATHENA Information Technologies RC and Co-Chair of SDSN Europe.



Professor Koundouri introduced the mission of the Hub:

"..."SDSN" Global Climate Hub has made it its mission to provide science-based recommendations for combating the climate crisis and preventing further deterioration. It will use extensive data, knowledge, and technologies provided by experts in various fields to implement country-specific action plans to be adopted and reinforced by society. Solution pathways included in these plans will include elements such as: (1) Existing technologies, (2) Circular economy, (3) Nature-based solutions, (4) Digitalization, (5) Innovation commercialization, (6) Sustainable finance and adaptation investment schemes, and (7) Policy reforms."

Highlights From This Year's High-Level Political Forum



This year's session of the High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) culminated on July. There were some of the key highlights discussed, including the importance of data infrastructure and timely, disaggregated data, the need for greater investments and financing for countries, and the value of localized and customized approaches to achieve the SDGs.

Several key research reports, datasets, and tools were released during the High-Level Political Forum, providing timely insights on the state of global, regional, and national SDG and population data, as well as tools for stakeholders to improve evidence-based policymaking. These included:

- New OECD Knowledge Platform on Policy Coherence


Localized Approaches to Address the SDGs

Many of the HLPF sessions also highlighted the importance of tailoring the SDGs to country circumstances, and that there is "no one size fits all" approach to addressing country needs.

Looking Ahead

As UN Secretary-General, António Guterres, stated, "The aspirations set out in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development are in jeopardy, [and] we need an urgent rescue effort for the SDGs." As we reach the mid-point of the SDG cycle, there is not much time left to achieve them, and SDG financing is certain to remain a key challenge over the next several years.

August 8, 2022 Kazakh National Agrarian Research University (KazNARU) hosted a round table "YOUTH FOR INNOVATIONS", dedicated to the World Youth Day. The meeting was attended by undergraduate and graduate students, and young scientists who joined online from different universities of Kazakhstan and the Asia-Pacific Region.

invited professor of KazNARU.

This round table has allowed young people to learn about the opportunities and potential of innovative projects, start-up movement, to celebrate International Youth Day.





Mr. Vlastimil Samek noted the importance of the event in implementing SDG17 and developing further cooperation among young people in Kazakhstan and in the region. He noted 3 important areas:

- 1) How important it is to implement SDG projects;
- 2) What skills today's youth need to make modern measures better and more sustainable;
- 3) The role of universities in addressing global challenges such as climate change.

Mr. Justin Rashid noted the importance of holding such meetings, both to unite communities and to involve young people in the implementation of projects related to the SDGs and safe community development at all levels.

Mr. Vladimir Popov mentioned several interesting and useful facts and ideas about the implementation and acceleration of project management and will already be able to apply it specifically to their projects.

Mr. Rafis Abazov focused on three important trends:

- innovation radically changes the format of relationships among young people, and the format of education due to rapid growth of ICTs;
- the important of the use of ICTs and innovative training in effective acceleration of startup project and commercialization of scientific research projects;
- student entrepreneurship and work on startups increasingly becomes the first step to forming a modern successful specialist in many fields.
