
SDSN Youth Kazakhstan and "Youth Climate Action in Central Asia" Project

FABLE Consortium presents a FABLE Special Issue, a series of 14 papers presenting solutions to find pathways to sustainable food and land use systems. These pathways focus on conserving and restoring natural ecosystems, shifting diets, improving agricultural productivity, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, and less resource-intensive consumption patterns.

The FABLE Special Issue shows that more ambitious actions are urgently needed to meet national and global sustainability targets on climate, biodiversity, freshwater use, and food security. Under current trends, none of the 12 countries participating in the special issue can reach their sustainability targets.

This special issue shows which actions would wholly or partially achieve the changes that are required to get food and land use systems on track.

SDSN TRENDS Centralizing Data Governance For Improved Data Use: A Case Study of the Philippine Statistics Authority



This case study presents the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), the central statistical authority of the Philippines' government. Its mission is to deliver relevant and reliable statistics and efficient civil registration services for equitable development outcomes.

The PSA was created in 2013 when the government merged four data-producing agencies into one comprehensive authority. This change in governance has played a critical role in strengthening the coherence of statistical production and the use of official statistics within the country.

Since its establishment, the PSA has achieved a number of successes stemming from the improved coordination of its agencies across government, including more centralized decision-making, reduced bureaucracy, more innovative services, and faster statistical production.
